

Rector's Desk...


From Easter to Pentecost

So, we have managed to get through Lent and reach the Easter celebration! And a great celebration it is. Jesus is raised from the dead, we are saved from our sins. and God has given us the gift of eternal life to share with Jesus in his kingdom. But this is way too big to be relegated to just one day of celebration. No, this is the perfect gift of God to his faithful people. This needs a perfect celebration. Thus, we have Eastertide; a celebration that goes on for seven weeks. But why seven? Because in the Judeo-Christian traditions God is said to have created all that exists int the world in six days, and he rested on the seventh. Thus, seven is the number of completeness or wholeness.


In the Jewish liturgical calendar, the Passover feast holds a place of importance similar to that of Easter in the Christian Calendar. In fact they both fall on similar dates between March and April on our secular calendar. Fifty days after Passover our Jewish brethren celebrate Shavuot. During Shavuot they remember God giving Moses the Ten Commandments to present to Israel. Another name for Shavuot is The Feast of Weeks. Shavuot falls on the perfect time period of a week of weeks, or 7 days times 7 = 49 + 1 = 50 days.

In the Greek of Jesus' day that would be Pentecost (50 days).

In our Christian liturgical calendar we start with Easter, then move 7 weeks + 1 day = 50 days to our feast of... you guessed it, Pentecost; where we celebrate God giving us the Holy Spirit that was promised by his son Jesus before he ascended into heaven.



In both cases God's people remember God acting in their human lives, to protect and guide us in this world and bring us closer in our relationship with the one who gives us life. Our Jewish brethren were freed from slavery in Egypt then given the law to guide their life with God.

I met a Christian man at our Regional Conference last October who began attending one of our newer church plants. As he introduced himself to me he said that his goal was to be a Barnabases to the pastor of that church. That really resonated with ne. Vocational pastors and non -vocational Christ-followers alike need to have a "Barnabases" and can be a Barnabas.

Barnabas in the Bible was a prominent follower of Christ in the early church. He was respected among those who were charting the "Way" in the early church that we now call Christianity. His given name was Joseph but the apostles gave him the name "Barnabas" which means "son of encouragement".

He supported the cause financially, vouched for Saul (Paul), and evangelized on missionary journeys. Who wouldn't want to have a guy like that in their church? Such people are needed. Barnabases are immeasurably valuable

I am transitioning from being the pastor to being the parishioner. Definitely an interesting journey. I'm also finding out that I cannot write the narrative. Throughout my ministry I thought about when I'd reach this stage of my life. I thought of being able to encourage young pastors, maybe even attending their church like my friend I met at the Regional Conference. I thought I' bless them with my library, not knowing that the digital age would negate that need. Nonetheless I still want to be a Barnabas until the very end.

Who could benefit from your encouragement? You don't need to be a vocational pastor to be one. Does your pastor need someone to remind them from time to time that you are rooting for them?

Send an occasional card, email, gift card, etc. It will make their day. Pray for him daily. Be a Barnabas.

Community Garden:

This is so exciting. We have purchased the necessary components for our raised beds: chicken wire, bed frames, pathway covers and pins, soil amendments, etc. We'll be donating some of the produce to benefit the Our Daily Bread food pantry. We may also have a "farm stand" on Sundays to sell the fresh produce. So, let's get started!

On Saturday, April 6 from 11:00 to 2:00, we'll start assembling the beds. Even if you won't be gardening, we'd be grateful for any help you can give us to get ready to plant. Assembly of each bed takes about an hour. Two people are needed for each bed. If you're not handy with a screwdriver, your two hands can help stabilize the frame during assembly.
