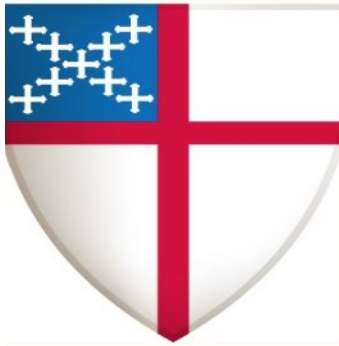

From the Rector's Desk...

It's like déjà vu all over again.

As we begin the new year together, do you feel the way I do? Do you feel like you've done this before? Do you feel that despite all the effort we have made, all the barriers we have overcome, all the little things that we have regained, that somehow, we are right back where we started? Yogi Berra once said, "It's like déjà vu all over again." And in his own way he was right. But for a more authoritative evaluation of the situation, we might want to see what scripture has to say. In the Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes, frequently attributed to King Solomon; we find the writer struggling to find the purpose of human life. Is there anything we can do to change the situation we find ourselves in; the illnesses, the monotony, and eventually the death. Can we improve our own situations through our own efforts? Can we make something new to change our lives? Ecclesiastes 1:9 states his disappointing conclusion:

"What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done; and there is nothing new under the sun."

So, there we are. Our current situation is just a repeat of last year's seasonal outbreak of Covid-19, only this time with a vengeance. If we compare figures from a year ago with today's figures, we will see that in Ocean County the 7 day average of new Covid cases has increased from

87 to 231. That is a 265% increase. Did we do something wrong? Is it our fault? This is terrible. Why we even prayed for God to help us, and it doesn't appear that he was paying attention. Just look at all these people contracting this new Omicron variant.



But this is where we, like Solomon assume that nothing new can happen, that we are doomed to repeat our misfortune over and over again. Look deeper into where we are. Are there 265% more people infected? Yes. How many are in the hospital? Last year, 267 people in Ocean County were in the hospital due to Covid. This year only 179 were hospitalized; 33% fewer. How many patients needed the ICU? Last year 50 people needed an ICU bed. This year 29 needed an ICU bed; 42% fewer. How many Ocean County resident died from Covid? Last year using a 7 day rolling average 11.4 Ocean County residents died each day. This year 2.1 residents died each day; an unbelievable decline of over 81%. If we only look at the new case count things are terrible. But, if we look at all the other numbers we can begin to see God not only answering our prayers, but working to make something new in our lives.

Does this mean that we should throw all caution to the wind and stop all the safety precautions? GOD FORBID! What it does mean is that God has not forgotten the promise he made to John in Revelation 21:5 “And he who sat upon the throne said,

“Behold, **I make all things new.**” Also he said, “Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.”

God can even make the Covid-19 virus new. He has heard our prayers and has responded to us in new and wonderous ways. I close with selected verses from *Psalms 91*:

91 Qui habitat

- 2 He shall say to the LORD,
“You are my refuge and my stronghold, *
my God in whom I put my trust.”
- 3 He shall deliver you from the snare of the hunter *
and from the deadly pestilence.
- 6 [You shall not be afraid] Of the plague that stalks in the darkness, *
nor of the sickness that lays waste at mid-day.
- 9 Because you have made the LORD your refuge, *
and the Most High your habitation,
- 10 There shall no evil happen to you, *
neither shall any plague come near your dwelling
- 11 For he shall give his angels charge over you, *
to keep you in all your ways.
- 16 With long life will I satisfy him, *
and show him my salvation.

THE POWER OF A WRITTEN NOTE

A handwritten note helps someone know that you care, you took the time to think, write, and send a personal note. Be thankful and share a thank you card or note after receiving a gift, or an act of kindness. Write it while the memory is still fresh in your mind and be specific. If it is a little longer than recently, it is better late than never, so send that note. Just imagine what you would say if you could see that person in front of you. Words from the heart are better because they are personal, and much more meaningful to the recipient. The person you write to will hear your voice, so be honest and sincere. You can make writing a habit, by doing 3 notes a week--send a note to say hello, or a note of appreciation. Thoughts of "remember when". or "I miss you", or "I miss when we did."...You can even send a note to yourself--sometimes we need a note of support and when your letter arrives you will feel that. Sometimes your note can be equivalent to a warm hug, a much needed thought in a someone's day, or a much needed pick-me-up or spark of joy in a sad day.

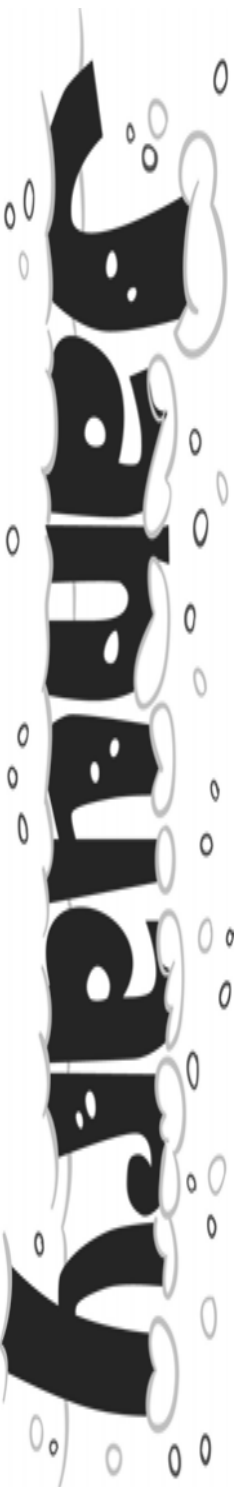

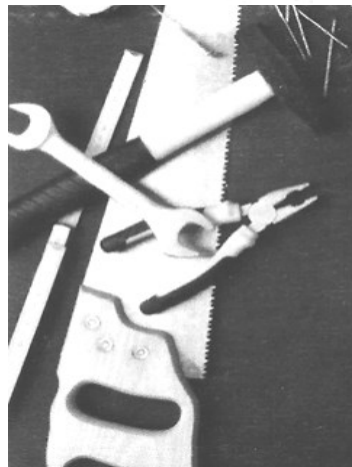

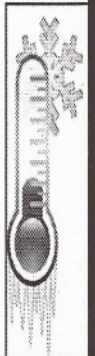
