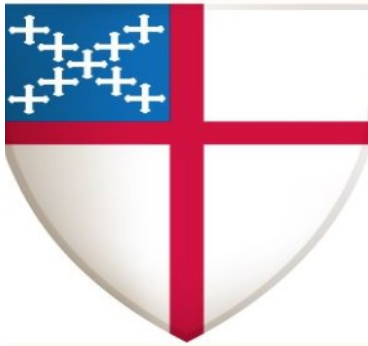

From the Rector's Desk...

How Can I Know?

Part of the responsibilities of any clergy person is to minister to those in his or her community who have no connection to any parish. Most times this occurs in a hospital or when there is a death in a family. Sometimes it is when a couple desires to be married in a church.

Recently, I have been involved in a few funerals of this type.

In all of these cases, the two most common questions that were asked by loved ones of the deceased were "Is there any way I can know, for sure, that he or she is O.K. now?" And "How can I know I will see him or her again?"

Saint Thomas asked Jesus this same question in the fourteenth chapter of the Gospel according to John. Jesus was explaining that he was going to die and then would go to Heaven and prepare a place for his followers. He said,

"...I go to prepare a place for you, I will come again and take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way where I am going."

Thomas responded, "Lord, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?"

It is amazing how much we are like Thomas. Just because we don't know how to point out

Heaven on a map, we claim ignorance as to how we or our loved ones might get there. The way to Heaven is not defined in terms of landmarks, turns and mile markers. Heaven is a place. But it is also a state of being. So, the real question that should have been asked by Thomas and needs to be asked by us is "What must we be, to know the way?"



How can we KNOW that we will see our loved ones again? How do we KNOW how to get to Heaven? We know these things by who we are... or by what we have become in this life. The hardest thing any of us will ever do, is take an objective look at what we have become. Are we loving, generous, helpful, selfless, and caring? Or do we tend to be guarded, self-concerned and protective of our possessions. These are hard things to judge.

But Jesus does not want us to spend our time judging all the minute aspects of our life to see if we are going to make it to Heaven. What he wants, is for us to decide if we have become just one thing.

When Jesus answered Thomas, he Said; "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but by me." In other words, if you want to know how to get to Heaven you must believe in Jesus as the son of God. You must BE a believer. If you are a believer in Jesus, then you will attempt to live your life in a manner which is pleasing to him. When you fall short and sin, you will ask him for forgiveness. When you feel tempted you will look to be strengthened by his grace.

If you are a believer in Jesus, then you will trust in the words he speaks to you in the scriptures. You will try and be more like him in your day-to-day living. You will trust his every word and action as the truth of God.

If you are a believer in Jesus, then you will travel with Jesus from your baptism, through the trials, rewards, difficulties, and blessings of this life, until you have completed this course and followed him all the way to his kingdom in Heaven.

You see Thomas had missed the point. We do not need to know how to get to Heaven. There is no map. There are no shortcuts. What we need to KNOW is JESUS. He is the way heaven. He is the guide who will lead us to our loved ones. He is the assurance that we will not be lost on our journey but will arrive safely at our heavenly home.

I saw a bumper sticker a long time ago. It said,

NO JESUS...NO PEACE

KNOW JESUS...KNOW PEACE

There is great truth to that little ditty. We will never be at peace without ourselves; we will never rest in the assurance that we will see our loved one again; we will never KNOW where we are going; until we KNOW that we are in a relationship with JESUS, our lord and savior.

Thank God Thomas asked the question. Thank God we continue to ask the question. And thank God that he has chosen to show us the Way in his son Jesus Christ.

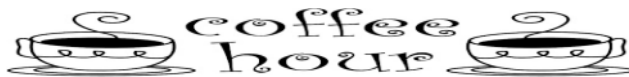

IRISH SODA BREAD COOKIES



This recipe is from an Irish cookbook and was recently served at the World Day of Prayer, the Corned Beef and Cabbage Dinner, and coffee hour on March 20.

IRISH SODA BREAD COOKIES

2 c. flour	1/2 c. sugar	1/2 c. (1 stick) butter, softened *
1/2 tsp. baking soda	1 egg	1/3 c. buttermilk***
1/2 tsp. salt	3/4 c. currants	1 tsp. caraway seeds**

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Line cookie sheets with parchment. Combine flour, baking soda, and salt in a medium bowl. Beat butter and sugar in a large bowl at medium speed until fluffy. Add egg; beat 1 minute, until combined. Add flour mixture; beat on low speed until combined. Add currants, caraway seeds; mix well. Add buttermilk; mix until combined. Drop teaspoons of dough 1 inch apart on the prepared cookie sheets. Bake for 10 minutes or until light brown. Remove to wire racks to cool. Can be served warm. Yield: 60 cookies.

* I used canola oil instead of butter

** I omitted the caraway seeds

*** I used a powdered buttermilk found in the baking aisle and added water (there was no buttermilk available). I have also added vinegar to milk and used that in the past as a substitute for buttermilk.

NOTE the original recipe dropped the dough by tablespoonful and baked for 12-15 minutes, yielding 3 dozen cookies. I found the smaller size was more popular. ENJOY!

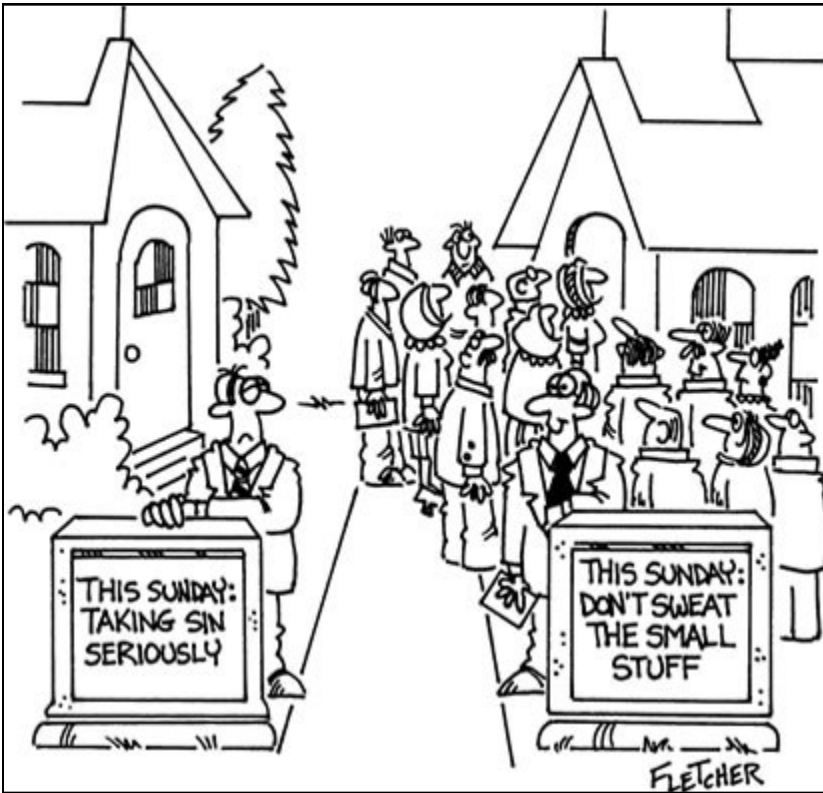

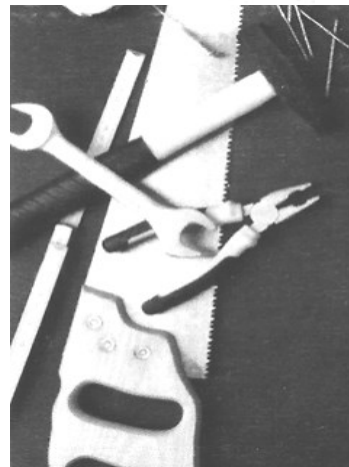

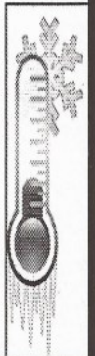
