

From the

Rector's Desk...

"Lenten Focus on Prayer"

As you have most certainly noticed, "There's a lot of prayin' goin' on around here! Yes, Lent has given us a chance to enter into an intense prayer opportunity. Starting with our February 25th "Prayers in the Pews" and continuing with our online Daily Office which will continue through to Holy Saturday. Why so much prayer? Because we need to stop talking about God and start talking to God. St. Paul tells us to "Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. (1 Thessalonians 5:16 -18 RSV)

In other words, be in constant conversation with God. From the moment you open your eyes till you are drifting into sleep at night.

Lots of folks have told me that this is not possible. What can we possibly talk about? God is not interested in my silly thoughts. Besides, he already knows everything. What could I tell him that's new? First of all, we don't have to tell Him something new to Him. We need to tell Him what's new to us. If you want a simple way to remember this just "Tell Jesus what He already knows." He won't complain. He'll listen to you. "God, I saw the most beautiful sunset this evening." "God, I saw a homeless person under the bridges I wonder how he came to be there." Better yet, "How might I help him?" "God I'm lonely, or hungry, or angry, or scared..."

If we want to set aside special times, like our Online Daily Office, we can use the time for intercession to offer our personal prayers. When praying, we should always start with Praise to our God, followed by Thanksgiving for all He has given us. Then confession of our sins and unworthiness. Remember when the Centurion came to Jesus to heal his servant? Jesus said he would come



to his house and heal him; but the Centurion said "Lord I am not worthy that you should come under my roof, but only speak the word only and my servant will be healed." His sincere humility and recognition of his sinful nature became an opportunity for Jesus to not only heal the servant of his illness, but also to heal the Centurion.

(Matthew 8:5-13). Then tell Jesus what your friends and family need. Finally, tell what you need. Praise, Thanks, Confession, Intersession and Petition. A good way to pray.



The Episcopal Diocese of New Jersey has elected the Rev. Canon Dr. Sally French to serve as the thirteenth bishop of the diocese. She will be consecrated and installed as the bishop of New Jersey on June 24, succeeding Bishop William H. "Chip" Stokes, who is retiring.

French currently serves as Canon for Regional Ministry and Collaborative Innovation in the Diocese of North Carolina. Prior to joining diocesan staff, she spent twenty years in parish ministry, serving congregations of many sizes and types.

Raised in Toronto, Canada, French earned a bachelors degree from Trinity College, University of Toronto (Economics, History), a Master of Divinity through the Toronto School of Theology, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Virginia Theological Seminary. She was ordained a priest in 2001. She and her husband Clarke have two children living at home.

In brief remarks delivered via Zoom after the election results were announced, French thanked the voters, the Search and Transition Committees, and her fellow candidates. Concerning her forthcoming position as bishop of New Jersey she said, "I look forward to serving with love."

The bishop-elect was chosen from a slate of five nominees by clergy and lay leaders representing each congregation of the diocese during a special hybrid convention held on Jan. 28 at Trinity Cathedral in Trenton and online via Zoom. She was elected on the third round of balloting with 68 percent of the clergy votes and 56 percent of lay votes. A majority of both clergy and lay votes in the same round was needed for election.

The Rev. Canon Dr. Sally French, bishop-elect of the Diocese of New Jersey, addresses the Electing Convention, as retiring Bishop Chip Stokes and others applaud.

"I believe the Holy Spirit has led us to a remarkable leader who is deeply grounded in the faith and love of Jesus Christ," Stokes said. "Canon French brings gifts and skills in ministry that are well aligned to address the needs and challenges facing the Church and the Diocese of New Jersey at this moment in its life and history. I look forward to welcoming her and her family to the Diocese of New Jersey and serving with her in this exciting time of transition."

The other nominees were The Rev. Canon Dr. Dena Cleaver-Bartholomew, Canon to the Ordinary, Diocese of Rhode Island; The Very Rev. Troy Mendez, Dean, Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, Phoenix, Arizona; The Rev. Janine Schenone, Rector, Good Samaritan Episcopal Church, San Diego, California; and The Rev. Dr. Mauricio Jose Wilson, Rector, St. Paul's Episcopal Church Oakland, California.
