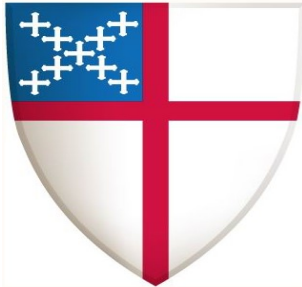

The title for this month's newsletter comes from the first line of hymn 287 of the 1982 Hymnal. This is a traditional Anglican hymn which was first published in Earl Nelson's *Hymns for Saints' Days and Other Hymns*, in 1864. It is traditionally used around All Saints' Day, for feasts of the Apostles and occasionally at a burial or memorial service of a Christian Soul.

The reason this was chosen to begin this article is because the end of October and the beginning of November is a time set aside in our liturgical calendar to remember all those souls that have come before us in the service of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

For St. Stephen's that would mean all the people who put their time, talent, and treasure into the founding and building of all we have today. It also includes over two centuries of faithful people who built the Diocese of New Jersey after the American Revolution and centuries of faithful people who formed the Church of England, as well as

over a millennium of Orthodox and Western Christians following Jesus' ministry from the first century. Whew!

But we are also to remember those souls who are working in our own time. Everyone who is continuing to support the work of St. Stephen's day by day and week by week, offering a place for worship, fellowship, forgiveness, and spiritual growth. This includes



all the groups and guilds associated with St. Stephen's as well as each individual member.

# MUSIC NOTES



## Choir

In order to present anthems with the chimes, we need at least 6 or 7 people who would be committed to rehearse weekly. Missing chimers is like missing keys on a piano – some of the notes simply aren't there, and the music makes no sense.

The Choir has resumed rehearsals. At this time we have just four members participating. We are expecting at least one of our customary members to rejoin us in mid-October. In a congregation where a large percentage of members are no longer employed during the day, it is hard to imagine that nobody seems to have an interest in joining the Choir. We will continue to try to present meaningful choir anthems during the offertory time. I try to select music with lyrics that relate to the lessons of the day whenever possible, although sometimes there is nothing in our files that "fits" for a particular Sunday. Our repertoire of unison anthems (no harmony, just melody) is very limited. We will adapt some of our anthems that are written for two or three harmonic parts, but will, when necessary, sing a hymn, or I will play something of my choosing on the organ.

Then there are those unborn souls who are yet to offer themselves to the service of a loving and caring Savior in this place and throughout the world.

But how can we say there are so many saints? I thought saints were special, perfect, even sinless individuals with some kind of supernatural bond with God. There couldn't possibly be that many saintly people, even over 2000 years. And in a way you would be right. There are not that many perfect people in all of history... but there are that many saints; because a saint is not a perfect person. A saint is someone who makes their very best effort to follow their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and live according to his teachings and example. The bible tells us that "All have sinned and fallen short of the Glory of God." But it also tells us to "believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved."

Saints make mistakes. Saints have doubts. Just think about Peter and Thomas. It is not the job of a saint to be perfect. It is the job of a saint to confess your sins, repent, and move forward in the love and forgiveness of Jesus, and in the guidance and strengthening of the Holy Spirit.

One last thought. When saints make mistakes they tend to distance themselves from God; maybe because of embarrassment, maybe out of fear. When this happens they handicap their ability to confess, repent, and grow. This is when they need the encouragement of what is known as "The Communion of Saints." The Communion of the Saints is the sum total of all the Saints, past, present and future. When we find ourselves stuck in doubt, sin, or even laziness, the Communion of the Saints are there to encourage us and remind us that we aren't the first to experience a fall from grace. They are there to testify to the redeeming power of the blood of Jesus and his limitless love and forgiveness that he offered all of us from the cross. They remind us that God is faithful and keeps his promises.

So, let us pray to God together, in the words of hymn 287: "O may thy soldiers, faithful, true, and bold, fight as the saints that nobly fought of old, and win, with them, the victor's crown of gold. Alleluia! Alleluia!"

God bless us all as we work together as Saints of God,
