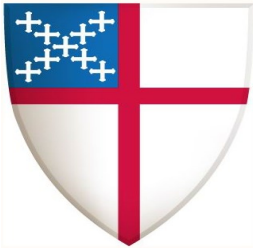

From the Rector's Desk...

How long, O Lord?

In the last several weeks we have enjoyed a number of improvements to our worship and fellowship here at St. Stephen's. Singing has returned to our 10:15 worship. Coffee Hour has been revived. Outside groups are once again using our facilities, and we have returned to several of our most enjoyable fundraising activities. However, there is still the feeling that things are not where they ought to be. Those feelings are reflected in Psalm 13. "1 How long, O Lord? will you forget me forever? * how long will you hide your face from me? 2 How long shall I have perplexity in my mind, and grief in my heart, day after day? * how long shall my enemy triumph over me?" What is it that makes us feel that God isn't taking care of our needs?

The most obvious is that the worship attendance is still behind where it was before Covid 19 began. Is it just us? Is there something we didn't do? These questions have been floating in our minds. They were in the mind of our treasurer Gerri Vergona and that moved her to do some research on the subject. After looking into a Church Trends publication she found that we are not alone in our situation.



In fact there are common concerns across most denominations and in all of our diocesan parishes and missions. As to the specific issue of attendance, Church Trends points out several contributing factors to the problem. First, is that the pandemic caused church members to isolate. This limited our ability to stay in touch to a great extent. It is hard to have fellowship in isolation. Second, is that people have moved (particularly the elderly) to be closer to family, even to other states. Third, is that fear of the virus has exacerbated a reluctance to return to worship. In fact, across denominations 17-25% of the worship community will likely not return. Of all churches that have reopened average current attendance is approximately 35% of their original attendance.

So, is there any hope of living out our mission as St. Stephen’s Church despite these negative influences. Psalm 13 answers the question it opened this article with. “5 But I put my trust in your mercy; * my heart is joyful because of your saving help. 6 I will sing to the Lord, for he has dealt with me richly; * I will praise the Name of the Lord Most High. God has not left us hopeless or helpless. Rather he encourages us to put our trust in him and move forward toward restoring the strength and effectiveness of our parish ministries in this place.

How? You might ask. Primarily, there are two areas to address. The first is to reduce the isolation factor. Go out and visit those who have been “missing in action.” A phone call is helpful, but visiting someone in their home is a strong way to show your caring and neutralize the isolation factor. Maybe you could offer transportation to church services to those who don’t drive. If there is still a reluctance to being in crowds, you might offer to help folks get “connected” with our online services as a step in the right direction of community worship.

The second area is stewardship. We need to facilitate ways to allow folks to contribute to the financial support of the ministries of our parish. This means to establish a functional stewardship program that reaches all our members regardless of how they worship with us (in person or on Zoom). It also means that we need to find new ways to offer opportunities for everyone to share financially in the ministries of our parish. This means investigating ways to offer contributions through Credit cards, payment systems on our web site, and such things.

The most important thing to remember as we address each of the issues effecting our parish family is that we are not alone. All the other churches are having similar issues. More important than that is that God is with us throughout our trials and will give us the strength, wisdom, and energy to meet our challenges one by one as we follow Him together.

ECW News



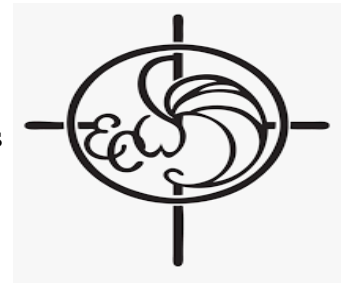
The Officers of ECW decided to hold regular meetings in 2022. Most fundraisers will be held in 2022. Details will follow.

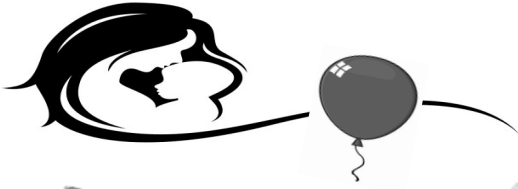

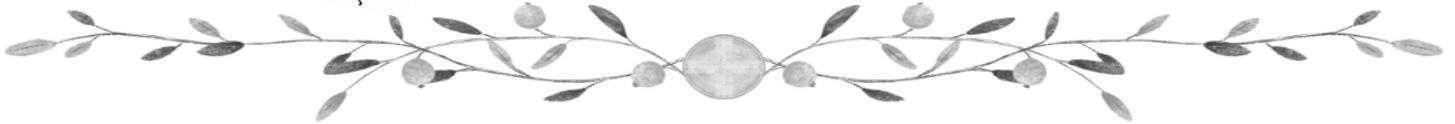

First, thank you Gerianne for your ongoing help. Those shoes will be a challenge to fill!

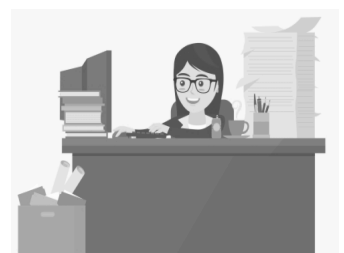

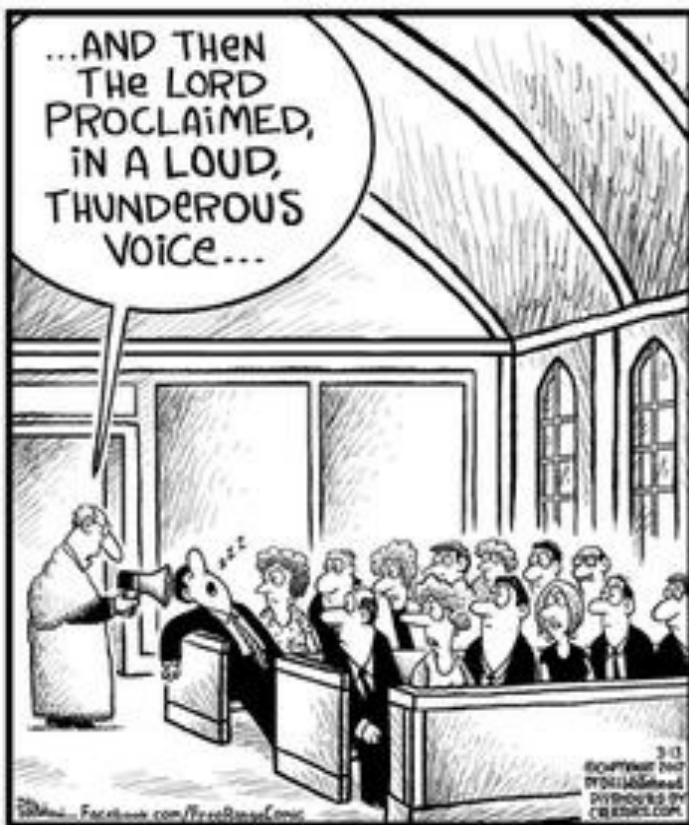

A minister told his congregation, "Next week I plan to preach about the sin of lying. To help you understand my sermon, I want you all to read Mark 17."

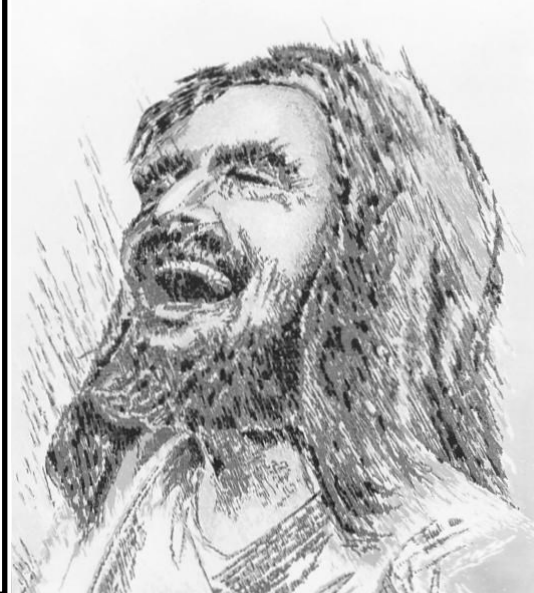
