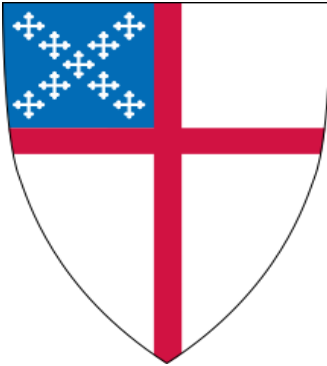

From the Rector's Desk...

The Bishop is Coming!

Yes. Bishop "Chip" Stokes is coming to St. Stephen's September 11 at 10:15 am. This will be the bishop's last visit with us before his transition to retirement in the Spring of 2023. During his visit he will Receive not less than three of our parishioners into our branch of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. We will also have a reception for him and our newest members immediately following the service.

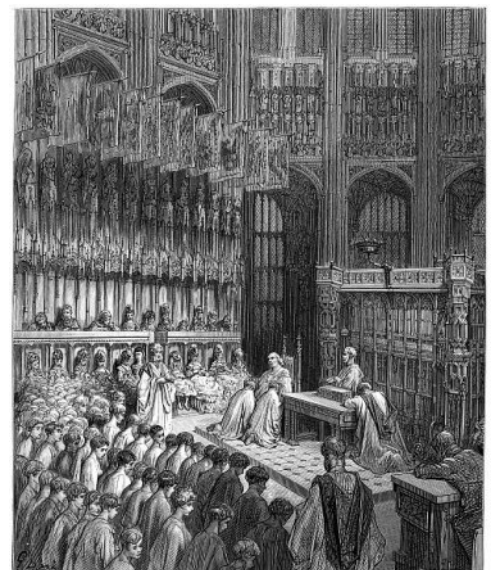
Bishops are important to the life of the church. They represent the Apostolic authority which has followed from Jesus first commission of Peter in Matthew 16:18 "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the powers of death shall not prevail against it." From Peter we have an unbroken line of faithful, earthly, shepherds of Jesus' flock; each consecrated by at least three other bishops since the Apostles. The word Episcopal originated in the mid 15th century,

"belonging to or characteristic of bishops," from Late Latin *episcopalis*, from Latin *episcopus* "an overseer". Reference to a church governed by bishops is 1752. With a capital E-, the ordinary designation of the Anglican church in the U.S. and Scotland, so called because its bishops [have authority over] other clergy.¹

We are not only Episcopal, but we are also Anglican. My departed father, "Fr. John Van Sant", acknowledged this on his tomb stone where he wrote: "Episcopal (Anglican) Priest" among his name and dates. The word Anglican originated in the 1630's,

"high-church, of the Church of England," from Medieval Latin *Anglicanus*, from *Anglicus* "of the English people, of England," from *Angli* "the Angles". The noun meaning "adherent of the Church of England" is first recorded 1797.²

The Anglican Church has spread throughout the world into over 140 countries which are known as the Anglican Communion.

The **Anglican Communion** is the third largest Christian communion after the Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches. Founded in 1867 in London, the communion has more than 85 million members within the Church of England and other autocephalous national and regional churches in full communion. The traditional origins of Anglican doctrine are summarized in the Thirty-nine Articles (1571). The Archbishop of Canterbury (currently Justin Welby) in England acts as a focus of unity, recognized as *primus inter pares* ("first among equals"), but does not exercise authority in Anglican provinces outside of the Church of England. Most, but not all, member churches of the communion are the historic national or regional Anglican churches.

The Anglican Communion was officially and formally organized and recognized as such at the Lambeth Conference in 1867 in London under the leadership of Charles Longley, Archbishop of Canterbury. The churches of the Anglican Communion consider themselves to be part of the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church, and to be both catholic and reformed.³

With all these churches in our communion there is sure to be things that we don't all agree with. Most of these issues have less to do with doctrine and more to do with cultural issues.

But rather than let these things drive us apart, we work to understand each other and strengthen the church as a whole. The same applies to the dioceses in our Episcopal Church. Don't let our disagreements drive us apart; let the things we agree on draw us together. I have been an Episcopalian my entire life and have lived through all the major issues of the 70's, 80's and more... and I have learned that what doesn't kill you makes you stronger!



We welcome Bishop "Chip" as our Bishop and recognize him as our "Chief Pastor" and a loving brother in Christ. May we all continue to serve God together and for the growth of Christ's Kingdom here on earth.

God's peace be upon us!

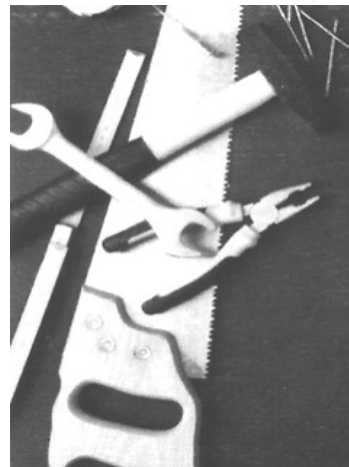

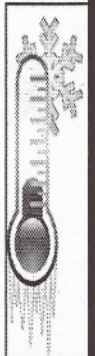
