

Welcome to St. Stephen's Church!



A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans 12:9-21

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with brotherly affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Never flag in zeal, be aglow with the Spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints, practice hospitality.

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; never be conceited. Repay no one evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends upon you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." No, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals upon his head." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew 16:21-28

If rom that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took him and began to rebuke him, saying, "God forbid, Lord! This shall never happen to you." But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me; for you are not on the side of God, but of men."

Then Jesus told his disciples, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit a man, if he gains the whole world and forfeits his life? Or what shall a man give in return for his life? For the Son of man is to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay every man for what he has done. Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Son of man coming in his kingdom."



Beginning with today's Gospel reading, the ministry of Jesus is directed toward his approaching death and resurrection and his preparing the disciples for that event. Peter, who moments before expressed his faith in Jesus as the Messiah, now recoils at the thought of Jesus' death. Jesus begins to explain that the way into the kingdom of God is sacrifice. His death and resurrection will be the model for that way. In the Old Testament reading the prophet Jeremiah, himself persecuted and rejected, reflects on his experience and from that comes to the hope of redemption through God's love.

We continue to read from the Epistle to the Romans in the second lesson. The final section which we begin today deals with the way God's people are to live in relationship to each other and to the world. Today Paul focuses on the varied ministries of all members of the church, ministries given to us in Baptism.

In the Eucharist we find both of the scriptural themes for today. We are given many and varied ways of ministering, and the Eucharist is a model of our ministries to the world. In the Eucharist, by remembering Christ's dying and rising, we become participants in that redemptive action. Our own lives are filled with its meaning, because we share in Christ's life, death, and resurrection.
