






A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans 13:8-14

We no one anything, except to love one another; for he who loves his neighbor has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not kill, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this sentence, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this you know what hour it is, how it is full time now for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew 18:15-20

"If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. Truly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. Again I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them."



As we continue to read through the Gospel according to Matthew, we now reach a section in which Jesus teaches about God's way of dealing with humanity: namely, forgiveness. Today's reading is primarily concerned with the church's role as the agent of forgiveness. Even when a member of the church is unrepentant, the church is not to give up on that person easily. Every effort is to be made to move the sinner to repent and accept the forgiveness of God which Jesus has commissioned the church to offer.

In the first reading, the Prophet Ezekiel is commissioned to warn the people of the need to repent. The central message is that God has no desire to condemn; God's deepest desire is to forgive.

Today's passage from the Epistle to the Romans deals with the characteristics of Christian living. Note that we are called to love each other and to recognize that our lives are completely bound up in the lives of our brothers and sisters.

We gather as the people of God, having found in our relationship with God that he is our Lover and our Savior, not an angry or condemning judge. We find in our lives together as church that we are not only the recipients of God's love and forgiveness but also sent into the world as the instruments of that love to all people.
