

From the

Rector's Desk...



Christians are one of those groups of people which, no matter what they do, seem to be unable to be justified in the eyes of those who are non-Christian. Not that we have to justify ourselves to anyone other than God and then only on the Judgment Day.

Let me give you an example. When I was just out of seminary, I wanted to spend some time with my family doing things which would give Andrew (then only 4 years old) good memories and a sense of family tradition. About a week before Easter, Priscilla and I boiled eggs and got out the egg decorating kit (I think it was a Paas Kit) and we let Andrew mark some of the eggs with a wax crayon that came with the kit. We helped him dip his eggs in the colors he choose and then went on to do some more elaborate eggs for ourselves. Priscilla and I are both pretty creative when it comes to arts and crafts, so we really put our all into the project.

The week after Easter we invited family and friends to visit. Of course, we showed off our pieces of art to all who would look at them. One of our friends, who we had just gotten close to, admired our work and added, "But I'm surprised that you do this Easter bunny stuff, Being you're a Christian and all that!" Now you can imagine if we had not done that "Easter bunny stuff", We would have been chided for not allowing our kids to enjoy the same fun other kids have! But we did, so she was surprised at that.

We all are aware (I hope) that Easter is the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus. But our Lord would be the first to say that a celebration demands us to engage ourselves in meaningful activities with family and friends. Remember what he did at the wedding in Cana to ensure that the festivities would be able to continue?



What is interesting is that Easter Eggs are not distractions from the meaning of Easter. They are symbols of the very essence of it; that is, they are symbols of new life! The symbols of the Egg goes back to the Pagans of Eastern Europe. When Christianity came to them the missionaries adapted the prevailing culture symbols to make the transition to Christianity easier. If fact, even the name "Easter", is an adaption of the name of their spring festival to the goddess Eostre since the celebration of the resurrection always falls in the spring.

is fortunate enough to have one. As a Christian community we should be looking forward to the upcoming activities of Holy Week, thanking God that we have the opportunity to accompany his Son as he proceeds from his entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, to his last meal with his disciples on Maundy Thursday, to his trial sentencing, humiliation and execution on Good Friday and finally, to his glorious resurrection on Easter morning.

Historically, the Egg was not only a symbol of new life to the Christians of

Eastern Europe. It also was an opportunity for Christian Folk art. Various styles of Egg decoration developed in each of the areas of Europe as Christianity grew. The most famous of all these styles was the Russian style of Karl Gustovoich Fabergé. Fabergé created eggs that were not only decorated in gold, silver, pearls, and gems, but he would hinge the eggs to form doors or cut the egg to form a diorama and build a scene in the egg. His work was at its height from 1884 until the Russian Revolution of 1917. It was cherished by Emperors, Kings, and Royalty throughout Europe and eventually the world. Today a Fabergé Imperial Egg commands a million dollars or more at an art auction which

We have inherited many wonderful traditions of liturgy, prayer and celebration from our fathers and mothers before us. Let us make sure to practice them during this most Holy time in the Christian year. And remember, you need no excuse to celebrate the Risen Lord Jesus Christ. You need only a thankful and humble heart and whatever eggseptionally meaningful traditions you have come to employ!

Wedding at Cana in Galilee (John 2:1-11)

On the third day there was a marriage at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there; Jesus also was invited to the marriage, with his disciples. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he



tells you." Now six stone jars were standing there, for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the steward of the feast." So they took it. When the steward of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, "Every man serves the good wine first; and when men have drunk freely, then the poor wine; but you have kept the good wine until now." This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

The Episcopal Diocese of New Jersey has elected the Rev. Canon Dr. Sally French to serve as the thirteenth bishop of the diocese. She will be consecrated and installed as the bishop of New Jersey on June 24, succeeding Bishop William H. "Chip" Stokes, who is retiring.

French currently serves as Canon for Regional Ministry and Collaborative Innovation in the Diocese of North Carolina. Prior to joining diocesan staff, she spent twenty years in parish ministry, serving congregations of many sizes and types. Raised in Toronto, Canada, French earned a bachelors degree from Trinity College, University of Toronto (Economics, History), a Master of Divinity through the Toronto School of Theology, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Virginia Theological Seminary. She was ordained a priest in 2001. She and her husband Clarke have two children living at home.

In brief remarks delivered via Zoom after the election results were announced, French thanked the voters, the Search and Transition Committees, and her fellow candidates. Concerning her forthcoming position as bishop of New Jersey she said, "I look forward to serving with love."

The bishop-elect was chosen from a slate of five nominees by clergy and lay leaders representing each congregation of the diocese during a special hybrid convention held on Jan. 28 at Trinity Cathedral in Trenton and online via Zoom. She was elected on the third round of balloting with 68 percent of the clergy votes and 56 percent of lay votes. A majority of both clergy and lay votes in the same round was needed for election.

The Rev. Canon Dr. Sally French, bishop-elect of the Diocese of New Jersey, addresses the Electing Convention, as retiring Bishop Chip Stokes and others applaud.

"I believe the Holy Spirit has led us to a remarkable leader who is deeply grounded in the faith and love of Jesus Christ," Stokes said. "Canon French brings gifts and skills in ministry that are well aligned to address the needs and challenges facing the Church and the Diocese of New Jersey at this moment in its life and history. I look forward to welcoming her and her family to the Diocese of New Jersey and serving with her in this exciting time of transition."

The other nominees were The Rev. Canon Dr. Dena Cleaver-Bartholomew, Canon to the Ordinary, Diocese of Rhode Island; The Very Rev. Troy Mendez, Dean, Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, Phoenix, Arizona; The Rev. Janine Schenone, Rector, Good Samaritan Episcopal Church, San Diego, California; and The Rev. Dr. Mauricio Jose Wilson, Rector, St. Paul's Episcopal Church Oakland, California.


