From the Rector's Desk...

# Disciples

On dozens of occasions, I can remember being present during rather animated discussions between people who were at odds about whether the titles of Apostle and Disciple are interchangeable or not, in the Gospels. I would like to offer some clarity on this matter.

An Apostle was one of the inner circle of Jesus' followers. In fact it was the twelve whom Jesus specifically called to be with him and share with his ministry. Later, it would include Matthias, who replaced Judas and Paul who was called by the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus. The Apostles became the leaders of the early church. As the church grew those Apostles blessed new apostles to continue their leadership in the church. We call these new Apostles bishops. That is where the term Apostolic Succession comes from: it mean in the continuous line of Apostles.

A Disciple, on the other hand, is one who follows. The word disciple means "pupil or learner", from the Latin
"discipulus". A Disciple
commits themselves to learning
from their teacher and adopting
a specific teaching or
philosophy that sets their
teacher apart from others.
Consequently, an Apostle of
Jesus is by definition a Disciple
who has been called specifically



by Jesus to teach others to become Disciples. A Disciple on the other hand is one who lives out a life directed by Jesus but is not necessarily an Apostle.




#### **Chime Choir**

Jesus is calling us all to be his disciples. To learn from Him, to be loved by Him, to receive the power and guidance of His Holy Spirit.


May we all be true disciples of Jesus; our teacher and friend.


# News from the Treasurer's





Hi from the Treasurer's Desk!






