From the Rector's Desk...

# Read the Gospel of Matthew

Just a reminder of your homework assignment from the beginning of Advent. Did you read? Are you reading? If we are to gain in our relationship with God during Year A of our lectionary, we really need to do more than just listen to the Gospel each Sunday morning. It is a help of course, but, we need more to get the full benefit of those readings. We need context. That context begins by being familiar with the whole of the Gospel; its time line, its setting, its themes; we can't get them without reading the whole Gospel.

The Episcopal Church is sometimes referred to as the church of the book. The book they are referring to is the Book of Common Prayer. That book guides our prayer, worship and basic understanding of who we are in a way which is common to all our members: lay people, bishops, priests and deacons. It is filled with scriptural wisdom and orderly forms of prayer. The collect for the 28<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost which will be on November 15 of this year, reads:

"Blessed Lord, who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."



This collect, along with many other parts of our Prayer Book directs us to the most important book available to anyone wanting to know God, the Holy Bible. Notice that it doesn't just tell us to hear and read.


No. It tells us to become intimately familiar with the Bible; to take it into our being so that we carry it and its wisdom with us wherever we may go in life. It also tells us that the Bible is not something to hold in such high esteem that we put it in a glass case or on a bookshelf and never bend the corners of its pages. Rather we should underline meaningful verses, put notes or questions in the margins, and bend corners to mark things we want to get to quickly.

Notice also in the collect, that we are to read "all holy scripture." So many Christians are under the impression that all we have to read is the New Testament in order to know Jesus and his will for us. That's not a bad place to start, but we also need to read the Old Testament because that is the scripture which Jesus knew and referenced in his teaching. Just think how much more we could understand about Jesus if we knew what the prophets like Isaiah or Jeremiah had said about him or what the first Adam was like compared to Jesus, the second Adam.

In order to assist in your growth through the Bible we are planning two Bible Studies in the coming months. First is a study of "The Names if Jesus." Did you know that there are no less than 50 names and titles for Jesus in the Bible? Each one gives us a unique insight into his character and purpose. The second study will be "The Women in the Bible." In this year which celebrates the 100th anniversary of Women's Suffrage, what better than to see how women participated in God's plans for all of us and his son Jesus? The first study will run from January 16<sup>th</sup> at 12 noon and 5pm, and run for 5 or 6 weeks. The second study begins the week after Ash Wednesday, day and time yet to be determined.

# News from the Treasurer's Desk

Wow, February came awful fast; I haven't recovered from December yet! As I prepare this, we are still working on closing out the books and reports for 2019.

If you have not already submitted a pledge card, please send one in as soon as possible. That information is essential for planning purposes.

If you have not picked up your box of giving envelopes yet, please pick them up in the Narthex. If you need them delivered to you, call the office and we will take care of it.

I heard through the grapevine that there may be some questions about our new giving envelope format. A little background: we made the change to the envelope because we've changed how we handle money when we count it on Sunday. The change in the counting process saves our volunteers about 30 minutes each Sunday. The new envelope design very easily synchs up with how we count and record the income. It also saved us a little money because fewer envelopes were printed.

Here's an sample of a giving envelope for a person who pledged to give \$25 per week for Operating Expenses, \$5 per week for Maintenance, and \$5 per week for Capital Campaign:

Only one check and envelope is necessary – you will indicate on the envelope how the check is to be distributed to Pledge, Maintenance, or Capital. If you only donate for Maintenance and/or Capital on a monthly basis, then some of your envelopes may not show an amount on every line.

Donations for Altar Flowers or other Memorials should still be handled separately.


The numbered envelope is a critical part of the record keeping process. PLEASE USE YOUR 2020 ENVE-LOPES. (If you use a 2019 envelope in 2020, your donation may not be assigned to your new envelope number.)

As you know, the team that handles the sorting and recording of income on Sunday are volunteers. The new process allows us to finish up quicker.

We are thankful for your continued contributions to St. Stephen's. This is what keeps us going!






