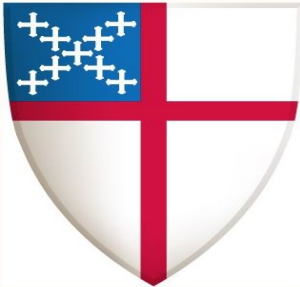

From the Rector's Desk...

## What is our Mission?

After serving two years as a curate in a team ministry in Camden, NJ, I arrived at my first cure in Berlin, NJ. As I sat at my desk for the first time I found a cartoon lying conspicuously in the center of the desktop. That cartoon (pictured below) seemed to indicate that by accepting the call to be vicar, I had also accepted a "Mission Impossible." There is always a sense of challenge associated with any mission of the Church. But there cannot be any God-given mission which is impossible; God never presents us with a task which calls for gifts beyond those for which he has equipped us.

Now you might ask; what is the mission of St. Stephen's? It is "to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ." And how is that to be pursued? "Through prayer and worship, proclamation of the Gospel, and promotion of justice, peace, and love."

O.K., But how will St. Stephen's carry out this mission? "Through the ministry of ALL its members." (see the Book of Common Prayer, pgs. 854-55). This means that you and I are responsible to God to use our gifts

and talents to meet the mission he gave us to do.

Now, "restoring all people" does appear to be a rather large task for any one church, and it is. But, as you might already have guessed, no one church is expected to do the whole job all by itself. Each church is expected to do their part in "restoring all

people" by reaching out to those who live within their community and offering them the opportunity to know the joy of being a member of Christ's body, as well as to receive the benefits of forgiveness of sins, grace through the sacraments, and everlasting life.

## Choir

I have an appointment to see a specialist in the near future, but after the deadline for submitting this article. I will try to keep you informed on my progress.

The Choir is in dire need of additional singers! We were saddened by the passing of Joe Nutry, who sang baritone with us for a number of years. We are fortunate to have very good singers in our choir as it is now, but having only seven singers when everyone is able to attend the service puts us at a definite disadvantage if anyone is ill or for other reasons unable to attend the service.

The Chime Choir members would love to resume presenting their music in the service, but we are in need of additional chimers. The ability to count beats (and understand how long various notes “last”) is helpful, but can be learned. Other skills are easily mastered. Please see one of our chimers to learn about playing hand chimes. We need at least 8 people who are committed to attend rehearsals regularly in order to prepare music to play at the service.

Stewardship is not just about sharing your “wealth” – sharing your time and talents with the Church is also part of being a good steward!!!
