

Rector's Desk...

Summer Means Sun

As our Sunday attendance figures begin to take their dip, it becomes apparent that many of our parish members are also members of the ever-popular clan called Sun Worshipers.

We really shouldn't be surprised. This clan has been a dominant force in almost every culture since the beginning of time.

Originally, members of this clan looked to the Sun to provide the power to grow crops for their food supply and to keep the weather mild. The sun was also the means by which they could tell time. 


