

From the Rector's Desk...

It Only Takes A Spark

Most of us will remember the old campfire hymn "Pass It On!". This song relates the love of God to a burning fire. Since we are just beginning the season of Pentecost and celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit, I thought that "Fire" might be an appropriate focus for this month's article.

Fire is a very interesting phenomenon. It can do helpful things like cook and heat; it can also do devastating things like consume and maim.

No matter what the ultimate result, fire has a certain set of predictable properties:

- 1) It needs a source to get it started.
- 2) It need fuel to burn.
- 3) It spreads from one point, outward.
- 4) It continues to burn until it runs out of fuel or is extinguished.

In the Acts of the Apostles, it is said that God revealed His gift of the Holy Spirit through the signs of wind and tongues of fire over the heads of those apostles gathered in prayer in the upper room. It was not simply chance that the writer of Acts chose fire as the sign if the Spirit. In fact, as many scholars have said, "It was inspired."

The Pentecost story spells out the most important aspects of the way the Christian Church lives and grows. It does this by likening our relationship with God's Holy Spirit to the properties of fire.

FIRST: The Spirit has a source. That source is God the Father and God the Son as it is clearly spelled out in the third paragraph of the Nicene Creed:

"We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets." (BCP pg.359)



SECOND: The Spirit becomes present in the world through the fuel of the faith of those who submit themselves to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Before Jesus ascended into heaven he instructed the Apostles and they followed His instructions in faith:

THIRD: The Holy Spirit spreads His influence throughout the world as those who posses the Spirit move outward from their closed rooms and encounter those who do not yet know the power of the Spirit and share it with them. As they prayed, they received the Holy Spirit:

> "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." (Acts 2:1-4) Then Peter and the others immediately went outside from the upper room and preached: "Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs which God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know-- this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men.

But God raised him up, having loosed the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning him, 'I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; moreover my flesh will dwell in hope." (Acts 2:22-26)

FOURTH: The Spirit will continue to spread until every human being in the world has come to know Jesus and the power of the Spirit; or until the world comes to an end.

> "And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved." (Acts 2:46-47)

At our baptism you and I each received a spark of the Holy Spirit as a result of the faith of those who have received it before us and burned with the power of that Holy Spirit. Let us make our goal, beginning this Pentecost, to continue to spread that flame by sharing our faith with others in our community who do not yet know Him.

In the words of the 3rd verse of the hymn which we began this article with:

"I wish for you my friend This happiness that I've found; You can depend on God It matters not where you're bound, I'll shout it from the mountain top -PRAISE GOD!

I want the world to know The Lord of love has come to me I want to pass it on."

PSALM 23

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.

² He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.

³ He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

⁴ Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil;

my cup runneth over.

⁶ Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever.

Future King David's most popular song is Psalm 23. He is in the wilderness being hunted for his life by King Saul. Yet he sings this song to the Lord about how he knows that EVERYTHING he needs is taken care of by his Heavenly Father.

David had been raised in a family of shepherds. He knew that a shepherd led his sheep to pastures to eat their fill and drink from fresh streams to their full satisfaction.

He knew that the shepherd would protect the life of his sheep. He would sit in the gate of the sheepfold at night and protect them from wild animals looking for easy meals.

He knew that the shepherd would use his staff for so many reasons. He would tap his staff on the ground rhythmically and as long as the sheep could hear that tapping they knew their shepherd was there and were comforted. He would use that staff to fight off the wild enemies. He would take the crook end of the staff to pull them from places where they would fall over the edge of a cliff or into a hole.

He knew that when the shepherd would hire a "hireling" shepherd the sheep would not feel the comfort and protection that they knew from their daily protector. They would not willingly follow his call. They knew the voice of their shepherd and would always answer to him when he called. They would listen to him sing softly through the night as he gently tapped that staff on the ground and would know that their shepherd was protecting their night time enclosure.

He knew that when the lamb would fall and break his leg the shepherd would pick that youngster up and carry him around his neck over his shoulders. After the leg was healed, that lamb would grow up with an amazing bond with his protector. He would love him for the rest of his life.

If the sheep got cut with a thorn bush, he would pour oil over the wound and bandage it up and take care of it until it healed.

Why do we call Jesus our good shepherd? Why do we sing of His love for us, his Sheep? Because He is Everything that you and I need.

2 Corinthians 9:8 says: And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work.

We will be singing this Sunday, along with King David about the provisions of our Good Shepherd as we give ourselves to follow Him just like the sheep love and trust their protector and provider.

FROM THE TREASURER'S DESK

Great news--it's Spring!!! Not so great news—pledges are severely lacking. The total annual pledges are about 50% of the anticipated expenses for the year.

Yes, we have Tom and the Fundraising Committee doing excellent work. Yes, we have the upcoming Tea Stefanie's team is working on, as well as other fundraisers in the future. But, collectively, that will not be enough to close the gap, unfortunately.

With concurrence from the Investment Committee, I have made some investment redirection related to our endowment account to reduce risk, and took out cash to be a more liquid. That enables us to use some of cash funds for expenses, if necessary, to cover payroll without having to sell portions of our portfolio at an inopportune time. As opportunities arise, we can still invest some of the cash in other short-term instruments, like CD's, in order to earn a return on the cash.



What does it all mean? We need additional donations from wherever possible. Stewardship is essential, as well as planned giving. If each person set aside a small portion of their estate (for example: \$1,000-5,000 or more if appropriate), that would provide additional funds for the church that has served you and that you love. That longer-term plan would help the church mission, and still provide funds for your family. In the future, we'll have more information on the latter. In the meantime, we're open to any ideas you may have, or additional donations from those who have not pledged, or may be able.




