From the Rector's Desk...


## The Season of Lent

The season of Lent has traditionally been associated with the practice of "giving something up." Most of us give up something that is bad for us: smoking, sweets, staying up too late on the computer. Some of us get more creative and try to start a new habit that is good for us: reading the Bible, spending quality time with our family, going to an art class, attending church every Sunday.

The giving up approach comes from the fact that Jesus went without food for forty days when he was forced out into the desert by the Holy Spirit, after his baptism. During Lent we have an opportunity to share that process with him. The doing something new approach also comes from Jesus' time in the desert, because he emerged a better and more prepared person than when he went in.

In both cases we are looking at what we **do** as a Christian individual. In other words, we associate our Christianity with our actions. We believe that what we do is who we are. A Christian does certain things and doesn't do other things. But is that all there is to it?

It seems that there could be some very important issues we could probe into during our Lenten or desert experience.



Oliver Wendell Holmes said it well. He said: 'What lies behind us and what lies before us are tiny matters compared to what lies within us." Applied to Lent, this would mean that we use these forty days, not to keep a tally of what we did or didn't do, but rather to take the time to look deeply into our very souls revealing what makes us who we are. To uncover the difference between what we have put into ourselves, and what God has put into us that we might be called his daughters and sons.

What makes us who we are? It is not what we have done in the past. As a parish it is not our endowment, our solar panels, our outreach ministries, or even our baptismal tub. All these things are simply things that have occurred in our family.

It is not any action we may take in the future. It is not giving more, attending more frequently, moving the lawn, or putting in a pet cemetery.

What makes us who we are is the Spirit within us that drives us out into the world to accomplish the will of God. It is called compassion, mercy, Godly fear, justice, righteousness, love, service, forgiveness, and faithfulness.

What we do is always associated with a motive. The motive is the reason we act. Do we give to say we gave, or do we give because we are moved from within to relieve the suffering of others? Do we cease a behavior because we don't want to suffer the consequences or because we want to care for the body God has given us and set a good example for others?

This Lent, let us look at "what lies within us" and who put it there. The most frequently reported feeling in today's society is fear and uncertainty regarding the Covid virus. Who puts that fear in our hearts? Certainly not God. God promises us that he is with us always, to protect and guide us. So how do we deal with our uncertainty, our fears, and doubts? Buy listening to God's Spirit within us. We will all have an opportunity to hear Jesus speak to us through the parables of the New Testament in our Lenten Bible Study entitled "Embracing the Uncertain" starting Tuesday March 1st at 11:00 am and/or 5:00 pm. Each week we will look at a different parable and see how God has prepared us to deal with the many uncertainties of life, and then apply those learnings to our current situation. Join us in-person at the church, on Zoom, and on YouTube.

Certainly, we can give up something that is bad for us. Certainly, we can try to develop a positive and Godly discipline in our lives. However, whatever we choose to do, let us do it because God drives us out into the desert of life with a motivation that reflects our membership in the body of his Son Jesus Christ.

May each of us become more compassionate, merciful, filled with Godly fear, just, righteous, loving, of service to others, forgiving, and faithful this Lent and throughout our Christian walk together.

The following is an excerpt from 'MY UTMOST FOR HIS HIGHEST" by Oswald Chambers. As we enter this time of lent remember that "songbirds are taught to sing in the dark...". We have gone through a dark time in the recent past. Now as we are headed into Lent, it isn't really a dark time. It is a time of reflection and anticipation. I think all dark time should be just that. Job said "When He has tried me, I shall come forth as gold." We can use this time to anticipate the gold that God has planned for us.

#### The Discipline of Hearing:

"Whatever I tell you in the dark, speak in the light; and what you hear in the ear, preach on the housetops." Matthew 10:27

Sometimes God puts us through the experience and discipline of darkness to teach us to hear and obey Him. Song birds are taught to sing in the dark, and God puts us in the "the shadow of His hand" until we learn to hear Him (Isaiah 49:2). "Whatever I tell you in the dark"—pay attention when God puts you into darkness, and keep your mouth closed while you are there. Are you in the dark right now in your circumstances, or in your life with God? If so, then remain quiet.

When you are in the dark, listen, and God will give you a very precious message for someone else once you are back in the light.


After every time of darkness, we should experience a mixture of delight and humiliation. If there is only delight, I question whether we have really heard God at all. We should experience delight for having heard God speak, but mostly humiliation for having taken so long to hear Him! Then we will exclaim, "How slow I have been to listen and understand what God has been telling me!" And yet God has been saying it for days and even weeks.

But once you hear Him, He gives you the gift of humiliation, which brings a softness of heart—a gift that will always cause you to listen to God now.

Come out and sing with us through Lent as we look forward to the celebration of our Savior's resurrection.


