

1 Corinthians 16:5-9

Even countries closed to the gospel are within reach. How can you play a part in the Great Commission and encourage others to join in doing the work (Matt. 28:18-20)? The door of opportunity is wide open for us to share the good news. We just need to step through it and see all the amazing things God has in store.

FREEDOM COMMITTEE

Our anti-child trafficking awareness program is picking up steam. The Committee meets on Mondays at 1:00 P.M. in case anyone would like to sit in. Reminder: this is not politically, racially, or ethnically related. Movie or not, human trafficking is a fact.

Almost everyone on the Committee is certified. A packet of research has grown into an "encyclopedia". A presentation has been developed. We have presented our plan to Fr. Jim O'Neil and his Council at St. John's Roman Catholic Church in Lakehurst. The plan has also been presented to Bishop Sally. So, we are moving forward.

We have started showing the Christian-centered videos provided by the USIAHT, US Institute Against Human Trafficking. We are using Pastor and Author Francis Chan's videos about what the Bible says about responding to such evil around us. A short discussion/Q & A will follow each video. The five 20-minute videos will be repeated to give everyone who wants to learn a chance to do so.

The next steps are quite a list. We are going to start by inviting the public to see the videos and have a discussion afterward. Those videos will be the ones for general awareness from the USIAHT site. We will be continuing to initiate meetings with clergy in the area.






A Puzzle by Míke Munson
