## FEAR



Fear can be a very powerful force in our lives. An extreme or irrational fear is called a phobia. I recently had the opportunity to think as far back as I could and remember my earliest fears. The first was witches and flying monkeys. That came from the Wizard of Oz. I couldn't have been more than 7 or 8 years old. The fear was intense and had me sleeping with the lights on for weeks. The next was around 11 or 12 years old when I couldn't take a shower without making sure the doors were locked. This followed my TV viewing of Psycho. The last and most intense fear came around the age of 18 when I went to the movie theater and saw The Exorcist... during Holy Week. That experience had me looking over my shoulder for years! In my



case most of my fears centered on evil, suffering and death. Whether those fears were rational or irrational each was a fear of what might happen to my earthly body, in terms of injury or death. Matthew 10:28 tells us: "... do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body..." Matthew

wants us to have a qualitatively different kind of fear, not a fear of harm from evil, but a fear of missing out on the eternal blessing of our creator God. God is the only entity that has the power to give us eternal life in his heavenly kingdom or to deny that blessing forever.

We are not to be afraid of God because we think he might decide to harm us.

## MUSIC NOTES & CHOIR



For several years we have been using “Word of God, Speak” as the Gradual – the song we use to introduce the reading of the Gospel lesson for the day. Generally, this lesson expresses the major theme for the day. I’m wondering if we’ve become so accustomed to singing these amazing lyrics that we’ve lost sight of their significance. I hear:

*Word of God speak. Let it fall down like rain. Washing my eyes to see. Your majesty. To be still and know. That you’re in this place. Please let me stay and rest. In your holiness. Word of God speak.*

In the example above, all of the ideas are separated and appear unrelated to one another. If we were to sing it like this:

*Word of God, speak, let it fall down like rain, washing my eyes see your majesty. To be still and know that you’re in this place, please let me stay and rest in your holiness. Word of God, Speak.*

perhaps we might be better prepared to receive the message we are about to hear.

By stopping to breathe only where there are commas or periods, we start to see more clearly the message of the song. It opens our eyes, hearts, and minds to the fact that the words of the Gospel lesson have much to say to us. The song is not there simply to provide “walking music” – its purpose is to prepare us to receive the Word of God!

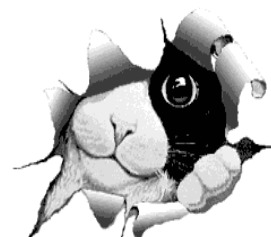
The Choir tries to present their anthems in such a way that the lyrics provide complete thoughts, often matching the theme of the lesson for the day. We should all try to prepare to receive the Word in a thoughtful way as we sing the Gradual every Sunday.

The Chime Choir has resumed rehearsals on Wednesday evenings from 7:00-8:30. Our Choir also would welcome additional members.
