

Rector's Desk...

What is a good life?

Naturally, the first thing that came into my mind as I pondered this question was the tune "The Good Life" by Count Basie and Frank Sinatra. That made sense. The reason I was even entertaining the question was a result of having attended the 100th birthday party for Marjorie Redfern. Marjorie's party included a presentation by her son and daughters all about her life. As I thought about the things they shared I remembered a more current song by a group called "One Republic" also titled "The Good Life." I have selected lines from the lyrics which seemed to remind me of Marjorie's life.

Woke up in London yesterday Found myself in the city, near Piccadilly

We're young enough to say

Oh, this has gotta be the good life

To my friends in New York, I say hello My friends in L.A. they don't know Where I've been for the past few years or so

Paris to China to Colorado

We all got our stories but please, tell me

What there's to complain about

Oh, this has gotta be the good life This has gotta be the good life This could really be a good life, good life.

Marjorie was born in Birmingham, England on August 17, 1923. She was the middle child. Her family had a liking for birds. Marjorie's maiden name was Ducker, Her mother's maiden name was Fowler, and her sister married a Crowe! She grew up in a normal fashion till she was in her teens. Then came WWII and the Blitz. Marjorie did her part as a young woman by joining the British Red Cross and taking on an office job. Majorie met her husband-to-be Arthur at a Christmas office party. It didn't take long before they were an item. Then he was drawn to NYC to follow his American Dream. Not to be kept from her soulmate, In May of 1959 Marjorie boarded the Queen Mary, alone, to sail to NYC. They were married on July 11 of that same year.



They had 3 beautiful children and led a family life filled with joy and many wonderful travel vacations: the UK, Nova Scotia, and a six-week NJ to California cross-country extravaganza. In November of 1988, after raising their family, Arthur and Marjorie moved to Whiting Station. They joined various community organizations. Marjorie was fond of Cosmopolitan Club, Bowling Leagues, and of course Church Choir, Deerfield Songsters, and Mahjong. Travel didn't stop. UK, Tunisia, Italy, Israel, Greece, and Germany were all on the agenda! On August 6, 2004 Arthur died unexpectedly. This was a great loss for Marjorie, but in her usual British fashion, she forged on. (Continued on next page)






Sunday Services at 8am, 10am Thursday Healing Service at 10am
