

From the Rector's Desk...

# In God's Image

According to Jewish tradition, the creation of Adam and Eve is believed to have taken place on the first of Tishrei, which falls in September by our modern calendar. So what better thing to do in our September Newsletter than to reflect on what it means to be a creature of God.

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." (Genesis 1:26)

The first thing we should note is that God made us because he wanted us to exist and have a relationship with him. In order to facilitate that relationship, he did what anyone would do and made us in his own image so that we could relate to him in meaningful image included That personality traits, abilities, and characteristics like God's. The most important ability he shared with us is the ability to create life. No, not Frankenstien! Babies. One of our greatest gifts is to be able to bring new life into the world which comes because love for us and a husband and wife's love or each other. And creation doesn't stop there. We create beautiful art and build beautiful buildings. We develop cures for diseases. We make music and instruments. We make machines that fly into the sky and beyond. Our imaginations are almost as limitless as God's.



Jesus said:

"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I go to the Father. (John 14:12)

The second thing we should note is that God has given us authority. We are responsible to make decisions for how we will obtain our food, create energy sources, set up a government, and just about any other decision that could present itself; with one caveat.

In other words, if we use the life God has given us by making decisions and using our dominion and authority in keeping with God's will and the example of his Son, Jesus Christ, we will be given the ultimate image of God: Eternal life. Then we can live and be in perfect relationship with our God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit from now and forever... Amen
